Sri Sri University has been ranked by Times Higher Education World University Impact Rankings on Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in the band of 601-800 based on all 17 SDGs. In the top four individual SDGs, Sri Sri University was ranked in the band of **101-200** for SDG 12:Responsible Consumption & Production. For the SDG 2: Zero Hunger, SDG6: Clean Water & Sanitation, and SDG7: Affordable and Clean Energy stand in the band of 201-300. Sri Sri University has been ranked **1st in Odisha, 6th in India, and 248th in the world** as per UI Green Metric Awards World University Rankings 2021 which is a quantum jump from 2020's ranking which was 3th in Odisha, 7th in India, and 304th in the world.

Being from the parentage of the Art of Living, one of the largest volunteer based organization in the world, and given the stature of the work of our founder Poojya Gurudev Sri Sri Ravi Shankar

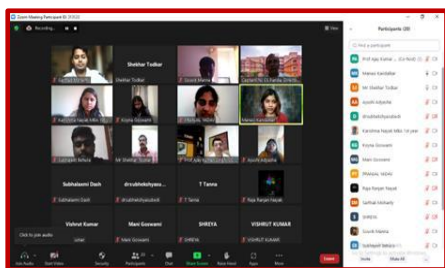
Introduction

High levels of armed violence and insecurity have a destructive impact on a country's development, affecting economic growth and often resulting in long standing grievances among communities that can last for generations. Sexual violence, crime, exploitation, and torture are also prevalent where there is conflict or no rule of law, and countries must take measures to protect those who are most at risk.

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) aim to significantly reduce all forms of violence, and work with governments and communities to find lasting solutions to conflict and insecurity. Strengthening the rule of law and promoting human rights is key to this process, as is reducing the flow of illicit arms and strengthening the participation of developing countries in the institutions of global governance.

Inner Peace Brings Resilience: A Tried And Tested Solution



For nearly four decades now, The Art of Living, a sister concern of SSU, from which the university derives its DNA from, has offered programs that promote peace and well-being at the individual, community, and global levels.

- At individual level: Programs to eliminate stress and promote well-being, caring and compassion in adults, youth, children.
- At community level: Programs to promote socio-economic development projects for disadvantaged groups, rehabilitation of prisoners and warring social groups.
- At global level: Peace initiatives to end violence in Afghanistan, Iraq, Israel, Kashmir, Kosovo, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, Colombia.

The A-B-C: Awareness-Belonging-Commitment is the framework for societal change. The awareness about the workings of one's mind; when individuals become more aware of their thoughts and emotions, they connect better with themselves; when awareness is heightened, the connection and the sense of belonging with all men and women is enhanced; the realization of inter-connectedness automatically and intrinsically brings forth the commitment – not just for oneself, but for society at large. As we move towards a post-COVID world; this principle has been used to transform the world for generations to come.

University Governance Measures

Elected Representation

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell, one of the highest governing bodies of the University has members from the BOG, the teaching staff, the non-teaching staff, the student's body, alumni members, and the local stake holders, making it a perfect example of inclusive decision making.

The Board of Governance (BOG) is the highest decision-making body at the University. It is led by the dynamic Prof. Rajita Kulkarni who is the President on the board. The mix of inhouse members and external dignitaries makes it a versatile and competent decision-making body.

Student Council

The student Council of Sri Sri University comprises of students from most of its faculty. Every faculty is represented by two student members and take part in the meetings involving students concerns. The Council meets regularly to discuss the ongoing issues pertaining to academic and

non-academic affairs. Even during the pandemic, the virtual platforms helped the council to continue with their efforts with enthusiasm.

Identify and Engage with Local Stakeholders

Sri Sri University takes pride in reaching out to the villagers of the nearby areas and helping them meet their needs related to health care, education, and employment. The department of Osteopathy regularly conducts camps for the people living near the campus. The Ayurveda hospital has become a boon for the villagers, who otherwise had to travel a long distance for quality medical facility. The Faculty of Agriculture has been constantly engaging with the local farmers to improve their yield and productivity, while also learning from their experiences.



SSU, in line with its goal of contributing towards raising the standard of living of the people near the campus, provides permanent job opportunities in the semi-skilled and unskilled work. The drivers, cook, plumbers, cleaners, etc. are hired mainly from the local areas and are also taught mindfulness through yoga activities and camps.

The University in its approach to reach out to the stakeholders is guided by the policy document which is prepared by keeping in minds the needs of the stakeholders and the vision of the institute.

University Principles on Corruption and Bribery

Sri Sri University gives utmost importance to ethics and practices it at every level. The teachers, staff, and students, all are instructed about the mal-practices that are not to be compromised upon. In this regard, the University follows the guidelines mentioned in its Policy document on bribery and corruption.

Academic Freedom Policy

The university's mission is centered on promoting academic freedom. Without the freedom to research and disseminate information without worrying about repercussions, especially information that is disagreeable to political groups or authorities, knowledge cannot grow. The freedom to express opinions on topics related to the institution and its policies, as well as on topics of general public interest, is a part of academic freedom. Faculty members should avoid sounding like they are speaking or writing on behalf of the university when doing so. They ought to understand that holding a position of authority in the community entails a responsibility to be truthful, to use appropriate restraint, and to respect others' freedoms of speech.

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Policy and Lawmakers Outreach and Education

Education, training, and coaching is not something that is the need of students only, but rather is something that even a professional would need to have throughout the career. Being a knowledge hub of multiple disciplines, and teaching life lessons beyond academics, Sri Sri University has the expertise to meet the knowledge requirement of government professionals from various departments and verticals.

Over the years, the University has taken a lead in training professionals in yoga, mindfulness, ethics, disaster management, osteopathy, leadership, management, ethics, etc.

Indian Navy: The Indian Navy, Ministry of Defense, Government of India having a Sailor Training Establishment at INS Chilka, in its objective to upgrade the skills and qualifications of its personnel and provide additional opportunities for Education for the children of its personnel, have signed a MoU with SSU. Both the parties have agreed to develop a framework for collaboration through:

- a) Providing an opportunity for Education for the wards of the Indian Navy Personnel in to various courses/programs at Sri Sri University.
- (b) Conducting training for Indian Navy personnel in identified areas for skill up gradation and human values through Art of Living Program.
- (c) Organizing Pre-Release Courses (PRC) for the retiring Sailors to prepare them in starting Self-employment ventures.

ASSCHOM: ASSCHOM has signed a MoU with SSU to work together on various green initiatives, where SSU can use its expertise to train and develop the work force needed for the goal. These may include national and international award programmes, cooperation in the field

of conducting outreach campaigns, exhibitions, and technical assessments in the fields related to sustainability. This may also include but is not limited to water efficiency, energy efficiency, green building certification programmes, environmental audits, industry connect programmes, implementation of government schemes, sustainability audits, green infrastructure, and research studies. ASSOCHAM proposes to launch joint programmes with SSU in consultation with the core team foreseeing a long-term relationship to pursue national and international interests.

Programs Initiated

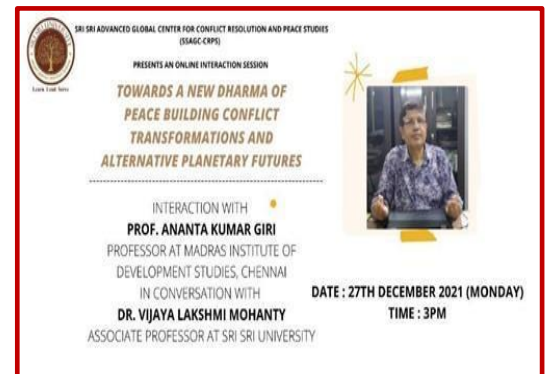

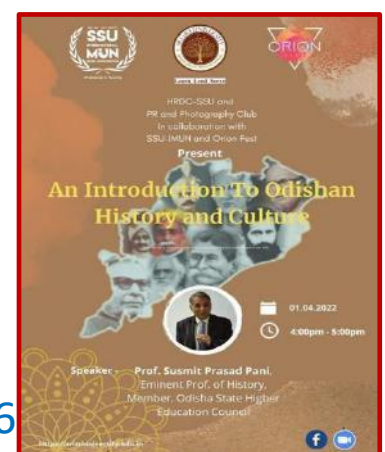
