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Description:



The percentage of students holding internships is 57.40%. There are 770 pupils. 442 students have been on work placements for at least a month.

Credited internship of students of Agriculture

Sri Sri University's Faculty of Agriculture is one of the leading institutions in the state of Odisha that has been given approval to include a credited internship as part of its curriculum under the state government's RAWE and KUS programs. **Plate 4**

Sri Sri University grants 20 credits for it in order to help graduate students in the relevant field of agricultural sciences strengthen their entrepreneurial skills. Farmers will teach students practical knowledge, to capitalize on locally accessible technologies by using integrated farming, food safety, the agricultural market, and best agricultural practices. **Plate 1**

READY programme

The Student READY (**R**ural **E**ntrepreneurship **A**wareness **D**evelopment **Y**ojana) program seeks to educate undergraduate students about practical agriculture and allied sciences. In this program, students learn about practical farming from an experienced farmer while also informing the farmer about new technological advancements and schemes provided by the government and private organizations for the development of farmers.

KUS (Krushi Unnata Sahajogi) program by the Government of Odisha is a 60-day experiential learning program through which students could learn from the department officials and farmers by understanding the prevailing conditions on the ground. **Plate 2**

A Village Agricultural Worker from the respective block was associated with the student to carry out the necessary works throughout the program. Students were uploading the data collected through the app and their attendance.

RAWE (ICAR Mandate)

The primary goals of the Rural Awareness Works Experience (RAWE) are to aid students in understanding rural situations, the state of agricultural technologies used by farmers, prioritizing the issues facing farmers, and developing the skills and attitude necessary to collaborate with farm families for the development of rural areas as a whole. 20 credits are granted to students in order to participate in RAWA. **Plate 3**

Approximately 200 students from various programs have gotten credit for completing the corresponding internship time. The curriculum was designed so that students might receive 3 to 16 credit points. Students are given stipends ranging from Rs. 5000 to Rs. 10000 when they intern in public companies such as Hindustan Aeronautics Limited, Mahanadi Coal Fields Limited, OMFED, Indian Oil Corporation Limited, Government Medical College, Kathua, and Mangrove Forest Division, Rajnagar.

For the 180-day experiential learning program, 20 credits are awarded twice in the seventh and eighth semesters of the bachelor's in agriculture, for a total of 40 credit points. The students will be prepared to manage a business from acquiring raw materials to processing, producing, packaging, and storing the products, as well as to arrange resources, assess profitability, and plan and administer a corporation. Along with a report on their performance, students display their work with the farmers. Farmers will teach students useful information so that they can produce qualified workers for the rise in entrepreneurship and self-employment. leveraging locally available gadgets through integrated farming, food safety, the agricultural market, and best agricultural practices

200 students who finished the corresponding internship time have gotten credit from various programs. The curriculum was designed to allow students to receive anything from 3 to 16 credit points. Students who intern are paid stipends between Rs. 5000 and Rs. 10000. A total of 57.40% of students have internships. It has 770 students. For a month or more, 442 students have been participating in work placements.
