Description:

Sri Sri University was envisioned by Sri Sri Ravi Shankar Ji, the founder of 'The Art of Living.' The University has a collaboration with 'The Art of Living' foundation, a multifaceted, not-for-profit educational and humanitarian NGO with a presence in over 140 countries. Among its



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various activities, environmental protection and environmental education are particularly significant. These activities include regular tree plantation, sustainable farming practices, river rejuvenation, cleaning drives, and environmental awareness campaigns, etc. Sri Sri University is directly and indirectly involved in these initiatives (<https://beta.in.artofliving.org/environment-care>).

Additionally, Sri Sri University has organized various programs focused on environmental education in collaboration with village communities and other organizations. Some of these activities are detailed below:

1. Sri Sri University, in collaboration with City University of New York and the US Consulate Hyderabad, organized a conference on climate change education on September 22 and 23, 2022. Environmental Science Day was also celebrated during the conference (**Plates 1 and 2**).
2. As part of the G20-W20 event, Sri Sri University conducted a workshop on 'Climate Change, Women, and their Adaptive Capacity' in two parts on February 14, 2023, and February 21, 2023. On February 21, an interaction with women leaders from eight villages took place at a central location within these villages. During the meeting, village women shared their opinions regarding their awareness of the impacts of climate change (**Plate 3**).
3. The second part of the workshop was held at Sri Sri University. A renowned speaker was invited to deliver a lecture on climate change and its disproportionate impacts on women in local languages. Women from eight villages actively participated in this workshop (**Plate 4**).
4. In addition to these events, regular talks on environmental education are conducted at the university.
