#### **Description:**

1. Sri Sri University has well defined sustainably farmed food policy (**Policy attached**).

#### Our Activities and practices in the University campus

- 2. As per policy the vegetable waste is used for mulching in the permaculture to grow vegetables
- 3. University is committed to practice sustainably organic farming in the campus (**Plates 1, 2, 3**)
- 4. The use of synthetic fertilizers and pesticides is discouraged to prevent any residual toxicity in soil and water.
- 5. In-situ composting mechanism is applied. The homemade "Jeevamrit" is used as a natural fertilizer while neem cakes are used instead of any pesticides/fertilizers.
- 6. A animal farm has been developed with organic principles to produce nutritionally healthy milk and milk products (**Plate 4**).
- 7. The rationale of building a farm with natural and organic farming principles has broader goal of achieving self-sufficiency to provide balanced and nutritious food to students and staff.
- 8. The Common kitchen of the university is supplied with these vegetables.
- 9. Students of "Faculty of Agriculture "participate along with other student volunteers in this activity.
- 10. University is committed to enhance to farm practices in the campus
- 11. University has its own cow farm (**Plate 4**). Presently there are a total of 62 cows. The milk obtained from here is partially used in the common kitchen, and partially sold to University workers.
- 12. Cow dung is used to make compost, which is eventually used in the farm lands of University.
