Sri Sri Centre for Translation and Interpreting Studies is a research centre established on February 22, 2021, by Pujya Gurudev Sri Sri Ravi Shankar to promote translation and interpreting studies in India as per the guidelines of NEP 2020. This centre for excellence functions under Sri Sri University, a State Private University established by the Sri Sri University Act – 2009 by the Odisha State Legislative Assembly, founded by His Holiness Gurudev Sri Sri Ravi Shankar. Since translation industry globally is witnessing a paradigm shift, fields with the demands of translator and interpreter multiplying manifold in industries and fields like, medical translation, community interpretation, newspaper translation, heritage interpretation, legal translation, machine translation, Parliamentary interpretation, etc., Sri Sri Centre for Translation and Interpreting Studies ensures that the students will be benefitted by joining courses offered by the centre and also assist them to find job opportunities in this ever growing industry.

Vision of the Centre:

Sri Sri Centre for Translation and Interpreting Studies is the first ever centre in any Indian university which brings together both translation and interpreting studies. SSCTIS as per the vision of the NEP2020, is also working towards a language lab for learning Indian languages.

The certificate course titled, "Professional Translation and Interpretation" will reflect industry practices in its curriculum, resulting in making the students fit for taking up translation and interpretation professionally and also provide them a solid basis for continuing on to a research degree. The proposed Centre with the help of state-of-the-art facilities at Sri Sri University and skilled faculties and academic staffs, and regular inputs from experienced professionals from outside will ensure the students of the centre gain the expertise needed for a successful career in translation and interpreting.



Focus Areas:

- Run Certificate Course in Professional Translation and Localization and training translators and interpreters for professional fields.
- Run Certificate Course in learning Indian Languages, i.e., Tamil, Odia, Bangla, Assamese, Nepali etc.
- Run Certificate Course in learning foreign languages, i.e., Chinese, French, Spanish etc.
- Collaborate with reputed national and international bodies to conduct translator training workshops.
- Finding out possibilities to acquire research grants by submitting projects to Government and Private funding agencies.
- Conduct Seminars/Panels on professional and technical translation, adaptation and localization.
- Signing MoUs with higher education institutions, other translation and interpreting studies research centres and corporates working in the field of professional localizations and translations.
- Publishing translated books of both literary and knowledge texts from the Centre.

The Sri Sri Centre for Translation and Interpreting Studies, FACIS, SSU as per the vision of Centre for Excellence is in the process of creating a language lab for learning Indian Languages. Calcutta Comparatists 1919 shall collaborate in organizing the Certificate Courses in learning Indian languages to be offered jointly by SSCTIS and CC1919 and engaging in relevant exchanges of teaching and training, thereby helping SSCTIS in expanding the scope of the Certificate Courses.

Revenue generated from the courses jointly offered by both SSCTIS, SSU, and CC1919 will be shared between SSCTIS, SSU, and CC1919 in a ratio of 40:60 manner. SSU will pay 50% of the collected revenue to CC1919 as a first installment. On completion of the programme SSCTIS, SSU will provide an additional 10% towards a Research Grant to CC1919. SSCTIS and CC1919 decided to collaborate in areas of mutual interest and may apply for funds from National and International Funding Agencies. On May 6th 2022, Prof. D. P. Sahoo, Executive Registrar, SSU signed the MOU on behalf of the SSCTIS. SSU, and Mr. Rindon Kundu, Director, SSCTIS, SSU became the point of contact for further correspondence. On behalf of the CC1919 Dr. Mrinmoy Pramanick, President, CC1919 signed as well as became the point of contact for further correspondence. The addendum to the MoU regarding clarification of the revenue sharing was signed on 10th December 2022.

Certificate Course conducted by Sri Sri Centre for Translation and Interpreting Studies First Batch of the 3 Months' Online Certificate Course in Tamil (April – July 2023)

The Sri Sri Centre for Translation and Interpreting Studies entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Calcutta Comparatists 1919 to support the acquisition of Indian languages in accordance with the requirements outlined in the National Education Policy 2020 (NEP2020). The first collaboration offering of these two organizations is an online certificate course in Tamil, with a duration of three months. The curriculum for the 3 Months' Online Certificate Course in Tamil was created by Calcutta Comparatists in 1919 and received approval from the Board of Studies of the Faculty of Arts, Communication, and Indic Studies, as well as the Academic Council of Sri Sri University, Odisha. Shri Sourav Chakraborti, an experienced Tamil language teacher with a 20-year track record, has been appointed by Calcutta Comparatists 1919 to teach the Online Certificate Course. He has held positions at prestigious institutions such as Jadavpur University, Kolkata; the International School of Dravidian Linguistics, Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala; the University of Calcutta, Kolkata; and School of Languages, Ramakrishna Mission, Golpark, Kolkata. The Centre offered an online platform and videotaped all courses for the students' advantages.

The course has received a significant response from various regions of India, with a total of 47 participants enrolling for the Certificate Course. Among these participants, 25 are faculty members from renowned institutions such as Jamia Millia Islamia, Delhi University, IIT Madras, Ashoka University, VIT Chennai, Christ University, Sahitya Akademi, British Institute, International School of Dravidian Linguistics, and others. There was a total of 22 students, including a postdoctoral fellow from the University of Cagliari in Italy, as well as PhD fellows from IIT Ropar, Jadavpur University, Sikkim University, Visva Bharati, University of Hyderabad, Sree Sankaracharya University of Sanskrit, EFLU Hyderabad, Bangalore University, and others. We had a total of four students that were enrolled in Sri Sri University.

The Certificate Course was launched on April 2nd, 2023, by our esteemed Director of Operations, Shri Gaurav Verma, and Executive Registrar Prof. D.P. Sahoo. Prof. Sayantan Dasgupta, Coordinator of the Centre for Translation of Indian Literatures, and Secretary of Comparative Literature Association of India was the Chief Guest at the inauguration ceremony of the Certificate Course. Dr. Sarveswar Sepoy from Visva-Bharati was also present as the Guest of Honour. Dr. Mrinmoy Pramamnick, the President of CC1919, and all the other office bearers from our associate organisation, Calcutta Comparatists 1919, were there. The regular weekly lessons for the Certificate Course in Tamil began on April 5th (on Saturdays and Sundays, from 6 to 7.30 PM) and concluded on July 5th, 2023. Out of a total of 47 students, 30 successfully completed the test. Furthermore, an impressive 90% of these students achieved an O+ rating on their final certificate.




Revenue Generated:

The combined efforts of SSCTIS and CC1919 resulted in a total net revenue of ₹ 1,19,000/- (Rs. One Lakh Nineteen Thousand) from the first batch of the Tamil Certificate Course, excluding GST. The NET income was allocated in a 60:40 ratio between CC1919 and SSCTIS, in accordance with the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) agreed between SSCTIS, SSU, and CC1919. SSCTIS generated a profit of ₹ 35,700/- (Rs. Thirty Five Thousand Seven Hundred) from te first batch of the 3 Months' Online Certificate Course in Tamil (April – July 2023).





Sri Sri Centre for Translation and Interpreting Studies organizes Tamil Lecture Series on 6th June 2023 & 12th June 2023






Posters of the Tamil Lecture Series


National Level Panel Discussion on PoCo/PoMo on 27th April 2023

Sri Sri Centre for Translation and Interpreting Studies, a centre for excellence under the Sri Sri University, is attempting, since its inception, to approach translation as an interdisciplinary field of study. As practices of translation and interpreting are increasingly becoming significant in the entire world and especially in a plurilingual country like India, the vision of SSCTIS is always to promote not only an excellent learning opportunity, practicing and research in the field of translation and interpreting studies but also become an interdisciplinary centre which will act as a bridge between diverse fields and areas. SSCTIS is trying to create an 'and zone' in this university where different areas of studies will meet, exchange their ideas, and enlighten us with the richness of knowledge. On 27th April 2023, Sri Sri Centre for Translation and Interpreting Studies organized a panel discussion on Post-Modernism and Post-Colonialism and attempted to understand the translational flows of concepts in both theoretical standpoints. 
