Description

Sri Sri University engages in **co-operative initiatives** that build local capacity to respond to climate-related disasters. At the **local level**, SSU conducts community workshops on flood preparedness, drought resilience, and waste-to-wealth initiatives in surrounding rural areas. The Resource Centre for Climate Change regularly collaborates with local Panchayats and self-help groups in Cuttack district to build awareness on disaster adaptation and mitigation.

At the **regional level**, the university collaborates through student and faculty participation in conferences and training programmes related to disaster management and climate adaptation, supported by the **Odisha State Disaster Management Authority (OSDMA)** and partner NGOs. Though no direct cross-border collaboration has been recorded during this reporting period, SSU's approach emphasizes resilience building within the Eastern India region vulnerable to cyclones and coastal flooding (**Plate 1**).

Conclusion:

Sri Sri University strengthens local disaster resilience through workshops on flood preparedness, drought management, and waste-to-wealth practices in nearby rural areas. Its Resource Centre collaborates with Panchayats and self-help groups in Cuttack to promote climate adaptation. Regionally, SSU engages with OSDMA and NGOs through training and conferences on disaster management, supporting resilience in cyclone-prone Eastern India.
